When Gregory first approached us about adapting *De Profundis* I was not familiar with Oscar Wilde's letters to his lover Lord Alfred. The more I learned about it and how Gregory, along with Mike Ross and Sarah Wilson, were planning to approach it, the more thrilled I was about their vision. Especially when I heard who they had in mind to play the title role, one our wonderful talents in this country, Damien Atkins.

Three years later, we're proud to be presenting this World Premiere as part of our 2024 Season. It has been incredible to watch this play develop through the years, nurtured by artists we have long relationships with, and some that are making their Soulpepper debut. Gregory Prest, Mike Ross and Sarah Wilson last collaborated on *Rose* - a multiple Dora winning musical presented here in 2019 - and their work has been seen our stages for over a decade.

They have taken Wilde's letters, and woven through actual testimony from his trial for 'gross indecency', songs and epigrams to create something truly unique. It's perhaps hard for us now to understand the level of celebrity Wilde had at the time of his arrest and imprisonment and how far his fall from grace was. *De Profundis* takes us into his mind, and we are given a window into how his time in prison changed him profoundly. To mis-quote his epigram – while he was in the gutter, he was looking at the stars.

Our next production in the season is the highly anticipated take on Chekhov's *Three Sisters* by Inua Ellams and directed by Mumbi Tindyebwa Otu. Set in 1960s Nigeria, this co-production with Obsidian Theatre features an all-star cast. This production is also the culmination of years of dreaming between the two companies. It is going to be a very special show you won't want to miss.

I'm looking at an old notebook from our early workshop days. It says, "We need to break it, explode it, and reassemble it as an act of love."

When Mike, Sarah, and I first sat down to explore the idea of adapting this letter into a piece of theatre, we knew two things:

- 1. Damien was the only person who could play Oscar, and
- 2. We were in the presence of something unwieldy, gigantic, messy, angry, tear-stained, purple, sacred, complicated, fascinating, frustratingly coded, devastating, profound, and beautiful.

I received a copy of *De Profundis* in my stocking when I was in high school. I'm not sure what my parents were thinking. It was the old Dover Publication edition - very thin with a bold prison bar design on the cover. I know I started reading it, but I can guarantee you I didn't finish. I was too young to understand it and I wanted and needed stories of gay love that thrived and succeeded (whether I understood that at the time, I'm not sure), so I put a bookmark in it (a small cut out photocopy of a portrait of Oscar and Bosie standing in a garden – yes, I was that kind of teenager) and carried it with me from city to city and apartment to apartment for over 20 years.

I don't think I'm alone in putting a bookmark in the place where it all becomes too heavy, complicated, and painful.

I had a fascinating conversation with my mother-in-law on New Year's Eve. She is a psychotherapist with a private practise, and we were talking about break ups and how even though they are one of the most common experiences we can have, they feel so incredibly personal, individual, and lonely and she said that over the course or her career, breakups and ends of relationships, are still, almost universally, viewed by those going through them as failures: even though so much has changed in how we talk about and define modern relationships in the last 10 years, the end of a relationship is viewed as something that occurs because we failed. The language is around failure. You failed. She failed. He failed. They failed. We all failed and with a feeling of failure comes shame. Very rarely are breakups seen as a progression, a shift, or a step toward something inevitable, meaningful, or even beautiful. It's hard to fail privately. It's even harder to fail publicly, and while Quentin Crisp tickles me with the very Wildean "If at first you don't succeed, failure may be your style", try telling that to a broken heart.

But maybe the broken heart is the needed target for such a proposition. J. Jack Halberstam writes about the queer art of failure: "it quietly loses, and in losing it imagines other goals for life, for love, for art, and for being."

I'm curious about how to make room for love when it seems impossible to do so. I'm curious about who we allow to be our judge. I'm curious about how an ego is dismantled in isolation. I'm curious about the healing power of creative expression.

Facing an uncertain future, Oscar writes in his letter, "If I can produce only one beautiful work of art, I shall be able to rob malice of its venom, and cowardice of its sneer, and to pluck out the tongue of scorn by the roots."

### "I treated art as the supreme reality and life as a mere mode of fiction."

Oscar Wilde (1854 - 1900) was born in Dublin, Ireland. His father was an ear and eye surgeon and his mother was a writer who supported Irish nationalist and women's rights movements. Wilde was a good student who distinguished himself in his studies at Trinity College, Dublin, and won a scholarship to attend Oxford. There he became influenced by the aesthetic movement and the belief that a full life was only possible through one's devotion to art.

His writing career began in the late 1880s - he published a book of children's stories *The Happy Prince and Other Tales* and in 1891 published his only novel, *The Picture of Dorian Gray*. From 1891 - 1895 he wrote four plays that cemented his career as a playwright: *Lady Windermere's Fan* (1892), *A Woman of No Importance* (1893), *An Ideal Husband* (1895) and *The Importance of Being Earnest* (1895).

At the height of his fame, in 1895, he was deeply in love with poet and aristocrat Lord Alfred Douglas, called Bosie. Enraged over their relationship, Bosie's father, the Marquess of Queensberry, decided to expose Wilde. Homosexuality was a crime in England then and the ensuing scandal pushed Wilde to sue for defamation. Unfortunately, Queensberry's accusations were true and therefore not legally defamatory. Wilde withdrew the suit, but it was too late. He was tried on 25 counts of gross indecency. When the jury failed to reach a verdict, friends begged him to flee to France, but Wilde could not believe he would actually go to prison. He was found guilty at retrial and sentenced to 2 years hard labour.

At Reading Gaol, Wilde couldn't sleep, was constantly hungry and suffered from dysentery. From out of these depths (*de profundis*) he composed a letter to Bosie, one page at a time. Part accusation, part impassioned apologia, full of anguish and helpless longing, it is the fierce, raw document of

a man confronting the sorrowful – and luminous – mysteries of love. From an artist known for his witty, flippant insouciance, the tone is arresting. It's equivalent to a tenor becoming a baritone, as writer Colm Tóibín puts it.

Inspired by this transformational artistic ancestor, our artists Damien Atkins, Mike Ross, Sarah Wilson, and Gregory Prest came together to create this piece. Director/Adaptor Prest calls it a mash-up, 'a 'love letter to the love letter ... celebrating Wilde's genius by using Damien's skill and genius.'

After his release, Wilde lived in France. George Bernard Shaw said that even after all he had been through, Wilde still retained 'an unconquerable gaiety of soul.' He could still say, 'love is more beautiful than hate.'

This is a love letter. Enter with an open heart.
