We're thrilled to be presenting Punctuate! Theatre's multi-Dora Award-winning production of *First Métis Man of Odesa*. There's a reason this show was the most popular touring show in the country in 2023 and why we wanted to bring it back to Toronto – it's a play that continues to feel urgent and relevant, speaking to timely issues in ways that are both moving and theatrically compelling.

We have been so lucky to have witnessed the evolution of this play from its original workshops during Matt's residency at Soulpepper, and have always been excited by how it is both epic and deeply personal. It's a play that shows us the effects of large-scale world events on two people who continue to find joy in some of our darkest times. It's also a romantic comedy based on the true story of its creators – a Métis playwright and a Ukrainian actor – their real-life romance, infused with the courage to navigate and transform their own stories into art, is inspiring. Especially knowing that they both stepped out of their comfort zones to do it; Maryia is a first time playwright, and Matt is making his acting debut.

This play is such a courageous offering to us – the audience. It is a daunting task and at the same time, a deeply momentous undertaking to create art out of events like the pandemic, and the continuing war in Ukraine – that not only affect them but continue to shape the lives of others on a global scale. How these two people found each other, reached out to each other, and now reach out to us despite so many obstacles that challenge and inhibit them is courageous and uplifting.

### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**



This is a love story. And like any grand, sweeping love story, our lovers are faced with grand, sweeping obstacles that challenge their fate. They are faced with modern challenges like Facebook messaging over great distances throughout a pandemic. And like the many great love stories that came before them, Matt and Masha's story is also set against the backdrop of war.

I have been witness to Matt and Masha's love story from the beginning. It is only fitting that these two theatrical romantics would fatefully meet through the theatre. It was at a workshop of my play *Barvinok* in Kyiv that Matt and Masha first met, and a second

workshop that brought Matt back to Ukraine prior to the pandemic. At the time, I had no idea that being a third wheel would grant me a unique perspective as their future director. I also had no idea exactly how quickly and significantly our worlds would change in so many ways.

When Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine began on February 24, 2022, it was impossible to turn away. For so many people part of the Ukrainian diaspora, the war was and continues to be omnipresent. Mundane, routine tasks are weighted. News about it is inescapable. The cognitive dissonance of scrolling through Instagram memes followed by images of horrific Russian war crimes has been a reality for the last two years. To be part of the Ukrainian diaspora is to contend with your head and heart breaking for your loved ones in Ukraine, and striving to not fully dissociate from your safe, physical reality in North America.

This is also a love story about Ukraine. I want audiences to fall in love with all that Ukraine is, undefined by Russia's atrocities. Just as Matt and Masha's love blossomed on the cobblestone streets of Kyiv, or the ultra-romantic promenades outside the iconic Odesa Opera House, there is so much about Ukraine to fall in love with. Like any grand, sweeping love story, this one shows us that not even the greatest obstacles, like the most evil forces of war, can taint true love. Matt and Masha's son, Ivan, is a reminder of this unbreakable spirit. Ivan is a beautiful union of two cultures whose love has created a symbol of the kind of future we are fighting for.

stars in First Métis Man of Odesa, which she has been honoured to share with audiences across Canada. The show won 3 Dora Awards, with Khomutova also receiving a nomination for Outstanding Acting. In 2023, the Toronto Star named Mariya one of the 'Breakthrough Artists of the Year'. OTHER: Mariya worked in two repertoire theaters in Kyiv and had an extensive career in Ukrainian film and TV. In 2020, Mariya won Best Actor at the Odesa International Film Festival, for her performance in the film Two People. Since February 24, 2022, Mariya has concentrated her work around promoting contemporary Ukrainian playwrights' voices to the global theatre community.



**KRISTA LEDDY** is a proud Métis multidisciplinary artist whose family comes from the historical Métis communities of St. Albert and Lac St. Anne. With a diploma in Arts and Cultural Management from MacEwan University, Krista is a part-time arts manager and arts advocate. She is a mom to Andy, Lily, and dog-child Louie.



MATTHEW MacKENZIE is a citizen of the Métis Nation of Alberta and proud father of Ivan (Eevan, Vanya, Vanichka). SOULPEPPER: First Métis Man of Odesa, and Baillie Artist-In-Residence in 2021. THEATRE: Artistic Director of Punctuate! Theatre, Matt is a two-time Dora winning playwright, a founding member of the Pemmican Collective, as well as Canadian Liaison of the Liberian Dance Troupe. Matt's plays

include Bears, After the Fire and The Particulars.



AARON MACRI is an award-winning composer and sound designer based out of Edmonton, Alberta. SOULPEPPER: First Métis Man of Odesa. OTHER: Over his more than twenty year career he has created music and sound design for theatre, television, dance, & film. His works have been broadcast nationally, and Off Broadway.



**LIANNA MAKUCH** is a Ukrainian Canadian director, playwright, performer, co-Artistic Director of Pyretic Productions, and a producer with Punctuate! Theatre. SOULPEPPER: First Métis Man of Odesa. THEATRE: Lianna has travelled several times to Ukraine to research and develop her plays Barvinok and Alina, which have garnered her recognition such as the Shevchenko Foundation's REACH Award, an

Edmonton Artist Trust Fund Award, Sterling Award nominations, shortlisted for the Alberta Playwriting Award, and as a finalist for the Gina Wilkinson Prize. Her work has been developed by Punctuate! Theatre, Pemmican Collective, Citadel Theatre's Collider Festival, Banff Centre for the Arts, and internationally by Wild Theatre and Izolyatsia Cultural Platform in Kyiv, Ukraine. Lianna's directorial debut, First Métis Man of Odesa, received a Dora Award for Outstanding Direction and has been seen on stages nationwide. Upcoming Directing: A Christmas Carol (Citadel Theatre). 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
