From Hannah's speech at the Royal Court Theatre, London, UK, at the 2024 Susan Smith Blackburn Prize Ceremony:

"I'm the type of writer who likes to explore the world lovingly, but with a knife. With *Red Like Fruit* what I'm exploring with the knife is myself. *Red Like Fruit* is the type of play where you think "I don't know about this play" because it's weirder and less funny and less charming than the plays I like to write, and also I've taken out a lot of the conventions, conventions that I like, the ones that make us want to watch plays. And also it's more truthful

and more personal than is comfortable for me. I think about my life as a document that I have redacted, because there are parts that are uncomfortable...so I take them out. But then if pages and pages of my life are censored, then my life just becomes fucking incomprehensible doesn't it - to you, to me. *Red like Fruit* is an effort to restore the redacted pieces of my life. Today was the first day of rehearsal for *Red Like Fruit*, in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada, the backwoods that I'm from. So when I got the call from the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize, the play hadn't been produced yet, and it was tremendous to find out that a jury of my peers and colleagues from all around the world saw value in a piece of writing that I doubted and that I felt discomfort about, so thank you."

HANNAH MOSCOVITCH is an acclaimed playwright and TV-writer based in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Widely produced across Canada and around the world, Hannah has numerous awards for her plays, among them Canada's highest literary honor the Governor General's Award, the Trillium Book Award, the Nova Scotia MasterWorks Arts Award and the prestigious Windham-Campbell Prize. Her music-theatre hybrid Old Stock: A Refugee Love Story (co-created with Christian Barry and Ben Caplan) won

the Herald Angel and a Scotsman Fringe First at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival, received six Drama Desk Award nominations in New York, and has been touring the world since 2017. In television, Hannah is the Co-Creator, Executive Producer and Head Writer of Little Bird. Most recently, Hannah was Co-Executive Producer on Season One and Season Two of AMC's hit series Interview with the Vampire.



CHRISTIAN BARRY is an award-winning director and theatre-maker from Halifax, where he is artistic director of 2b theatre company. Soulpepper: Debut; Other Theatre: Christian has directed shows that have toured nationally and internationally, including: Old Stock: A Refugee Love Story (National Arts Centre, Edinburgh Fringe), The God that Comes (Edinburgh Fringe, PuSh, Tarragon, Noorderzon), Revisited (WorldStage, Theaterformen, PuSh Festival), and The Russian Play (Canadian Tour).
