I love Pinter because he trusts an audience.

The mysteries within his plays rely on our intelligence and intuition.

The night I first read *Old Times* I could not sleep. I was gripped, disturbed, beguiled. When it first premiered, Pinter's collaborators and the media demanded his commentary on the play. Yet he remained resolutely quiet

on the subject, and became famous for providing no explanation for any of his work. Pinter could at times be a cunning and mischievous man. But make no mistake, he was a consummate craftsman of the theatre.

A Pinter play is like a lasting poem: its meaning both expansive and elusive. Pinter once said, "Meaning begins in the words, in the action, continues in your head and ends nowhere. There is no end to meaning. Meaning which is resolved, parceled, labeled and ready for export is dead, impertinent – and meaningless."

Old Times is considered one of Pinter's greatest achievements and directing this play has been thrilling. I am so grateful to be back at Soulpepper to open the new season with this modern classic.

I will leave you with this morsel: in a 1971 interview Pinter did once let slip commentary about this play. "I'll tell you one thing about *Old Times*. It happens."

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
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






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
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
