THE OPPORTUNITY

Soulpepper is looking for emerging digital artists to work as camera operator, director, lighting designer and video editor for our second annual Queer Youth Cabaret. This position represents an opportunity to join a creative and dynamic arts organization.

This opportunity is open to individuals who self-identify as Two-spirit, Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans, Non-Binary, Intersex, Asexual, Pansexual, as well as all other across the sexuality and gender continuum

THE POSITIONS

These are paid positions; we are looking for: Director Camera Operator/ Assistant Director Lighting Designer (non-union) Video Editor

Contract Dates/Times*:

Director: Concept and shot preparation submitted by April 30. Director on site for three days of filming to take place the week of May 17 (40 Hours Max)

Camera Operator/Assistant Director: Assist with concept and shot preparation submitted by April 30. Camera operation for three days of filming to take place the week of May 17 (40 Hours Max) **Editor:** Editing to take place between June 1 and June 16 (25 Hours Max)

Lighting Designer: Lighting design to be submitted by April 30 (40 Hours of work Max). Lighting Hang to take place the week of May 10 (25 Hours of work Max) (Total Hours of work 65 Max)

Will include pre-production meetings outside of these times.

*Please note: All filming times will take place *in-person*, using Toronto Public health guidelines. Rehearsals and pre-production work will occur *digitally*.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Reporting to the Head of Education and the Production Manager, these roles will play a key role in facilitating Soulpepper's second annual Queer Youth Cabaret.

Specific responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Collaborating with the Education and Production departments
- Editor: Edit, enhance, and work with an editing software to create a dynamic presentation out of several different performances
- Camera Operator: Rental equipment research, concept and shot preparation, camera operation for three filming days, prep meetings
- Assistant Director: Concept and shot preparation, on set for three filming days, prep meetings
- Lighting Designer: Lighting design plot, lighting hang/focus/levels day, prep meeting,

QUALIFICATIONS

To be eligible to apply, the individual must:

- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* 6; and,
- Be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial/territorial legislation and regulations.

- Participation in a Soulpepper Youth Program in a previous year is an asset
- (Camera Operator only) Have experience with different video equipment and sound set ups. Please note, if you do not have equipment, video and audio equipment will be provided by Soulpepper.
- (Lighting Designers only) Have access to Vectorworks, AutoCAD, or any other design software
- (Editors only) Have access to Adobe Premiere, Final Cut Pro, or any other editing software

The successful candidate will have:

- Experience in Film, Media Production OR Lighting Design (at any level)
- Demonstrated leadership skills
- A strong interest in theatre, performance, and/or film production
- Professionalism, maturity and sensitivity to confidential information
