I am because you are. This is how we catch creation.

This is how we have started every day of rehearsal the last few weeks, inspired by the Southern African Ubuntu philosophy that acknowledges our interdependence and need for each other as humanity, and the collaborative and interconnected nature of how we create and why we continue to create as artists.

I loved this play from the first time I read it. It fuelled me with hope and joy at a time when I felt hopeless, dealing with the post pandemic challenges that many of us have faced in the shifting social and economic landscape of our city.

The characters in this play are relentless and free in their pursuit of art, creativity and possibility, in spite of the challenges. They pursue their desires and intersect in messy, fluid and complicated ways that span time and generations.

The themes of Black feminism at the centre of the piece are unique and exciting in ways I haven't seen quite explored on stage before.

I hope you catch creation watching this play. I hope you leave celebrating the artist within you and around you. I hope this play leaves you thinking about legacy and impact and the relationships and pieces of ourselves we want to be remembered after we are gone.

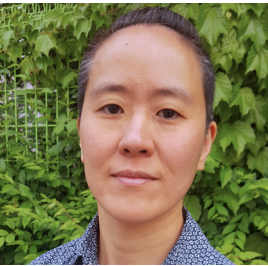

CHRISTINA ANDERSON's plays include: *the ripple*, *the wave that carried me home*, *How to Catch Creation*, and *pen/man/ship*. Her work has been produced across the country including theaters such as Berkeley Rep, Goodman Theatre, Oregon Shakespeare Festival, Portland Center Stage, and Yale Rep. A Tony nominated writer for Outstanding Book of a Broadway musical, Anderson has received the Steinberg/ATCA New Play Award, the Horton Foote Prize, and the United States Artists Fellowship, among many other honors. She is the author of *Three Plays* by Christina Anderson, a collection of her work published by Tripwire Harlot Press. Education: Brown University and Yale School of Drama. She's taught playwriting at Rutgers University, SUNY Purchase, Wesleyan University, Brown, and YSD. Since 2019, she's also been exploring music production under the moniker Purely Magenta, creating hip-hop instrumentals that reflect her inquisitive spirit. Current writing project: a book that explores playwriting as an accessible artistic life practice.



LAURA BAXTER has had the pleasure of stage managing for theatres across the country and around Toronto, including Buddies in Bad Times, Soulpepper Theatre, Obsidian Theatre, Nightwood, YPT, Factory Theatre, Canadian Stage, Studio 180, Dance Immersion, Tarragon Theatre, Cahoots, Theatre Passe Muraille, Blyth Festival, Caravan Farm Theatre, and others. HEIDI WAI-YEE CHAN creates music and sound for theatre, dance, and other media. She plays Japanese and Chinese bamboo flutes, percussion, synthesizers, and occasionally the ukulele. When not working in theatre, Heidi performs as a member of Japanese folk ensemble ten ten. Heidi has worked as a film sound editor and foley artist in Hong Kong, and has toured with UK's Shakespeare's Globe as a live multi-instrumentalist.



AMANDA CORDNER is an electrifying, award-winning theatre artist known for fearless transformation, physical command, and emotional precision. Actor, clown, and creator, Amanda builds work that is bold, intimate, and impossible to ignore. A Dora Mavor Moore Award winner for portraying 14 characters in *Snow White* at Young People's Theatre, they have been named one of Canada's Top Ten Theatre Artists and continue to shape the country's contemporary stage.

Internationally, Amanda has performed as solo actor/narrator with the renowned Baroque orchestra Tafelmusik in *The Gull, the Raccoon & the Last Maple*. They are widely recognized for their breakout, award-nominated performance as 7ven on CBC/HBO Max's *Sort Of*, bringing that same dynamism to screen work including *The Expanse, The Baroness von Sketch Show,* and *Slo Pitch*.

How to Catch Creation marks their debut with Obsidian Theatre Company, Soulpepper, and Nightwood Theatre.



LISA KAREN COX is an Intimacy Director, Movement Director and Director dedicated to the intersection of truth, physical storytelling and intimacy. With a career spanning over two decades, she crafts bold, physically charged narratives that prioritize both artistic excellence and actor agency.

As an specialist in intimacy and movement, Lisa brings a rare precision to the stage, navigating complex character dynamics with a focus on actor agency, consent, and embodied narrative clarity. Her work is defined by its ability to translate deep internal stakes and story into visceral, embodied action, ensuring that every movement serves the narrative while maintaining a brave, safe and professional creative environment.

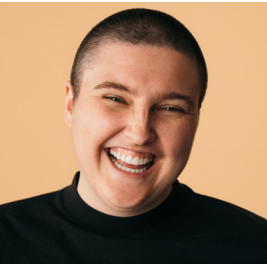

SHAKURA DICKSON is a Dora – Nominated artist based in Toronto. ANDRE DU TOIT is a lighting designer for live performance based in Toronto, although his designs have been seen across Canada and beyond. FRANK/IE is a trans, queer, white settler who grew up on Treaty 6 land and now calls Tkaronto home.



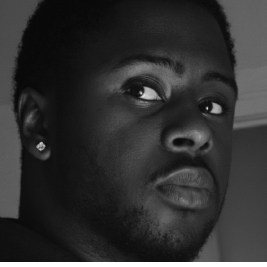
DAREN A. HERBERT is a Bermudian Canadian artist whose love for acting continues to grow. He is a multiple Dora Award and Toronto Theatre Critics Award winner, a Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle Award winner and a NAACP Theatre Award Nominee. Daren also received the Earl Cameron Award, recognizing his achievements in theatre, film and television, from the Bermuda Arts Council in 2022. Daren is one of the founding members of the Gracemoon Arts Company. For over a decade, he has been training with a gifted ensemble under the mentorship of Michèle Lonsdale-Smith. Daren serves as a member of the Sheridan College Music Theatre Performance PAC and is a past board member of the Musical Stage Co. He earned his MFA in Drama from the University of California, Irvine and a BFA in Theatre Arts from The University of the Arts, in Philadelphia.



GERMAINE KONJI is a Kenyan-Canadian director, actor, singer and writer. Born in Kenya and raised in Canada, Germaine's work is rooted in community and storytelling as a means of survival, resistance, and joy. Most recently, Germaine assistant directed a *profoundly affectionate, passionate devotion to someone (-noun)* (Tarragon/ Obsidian) as well as directed Obsidian's inaugural Black Queer Voices spotlight. Germaine is a 2020 Syd & Shirley Banks Prize recipient, a four time Dora award nominee, and one of six performers recognized as a Breakthrough Toronto Stage Artist of 2022.



ESIE MENSAH is an award-winning choreographer, director, dancer, educator, and TEDx speaker, whose work spans dance, theatre, opera, and film/TV. She has collaborated with Rihanna, Drake, Nelly Furtado, Kenny Ortega, and clients like Canada's Got Talent, Holt Renfrew, Deloitte, and the Toronto Raptors. Her work has toured nationally and internationally. Theatre credits include choreography for Soulpepper, Obsidian, Shaw Festival, Stratford Festival and directing *Serving Elizabeth* at Theatre Aquarius. She choreographed Scott Joplin's opera *Treemonisha: A Musical Reimagining* and was Artist in Residence at Fall for Dance North in October 2025 and debuted her most ambitious production ZAYO which debuted in Toronto and in Milan, Italy.



DANTÉ PRINCE is an Artist born and raised in Scarborough, Ontario. He self describes as having an obsession with the craft of storytelling. Committing himself to refine his discipline. To be the best Actor, Playwright, or whatever else he can be. He feels very grateful to have been able to do this as a career. Living out long time dreams that even he didn't know were there. And he hopes to eventually be able to share his art with everyone reading this.



TERESA PRZYBYLSKI is an architect and a theatre designer. She is known for her designs in theatre, opera, dance and film. Her credits include designs for National Arts Centre, Stratford Shakespeare Festival, Shaw Festival, Canadian Opera Company, Opera Theatre of St. Louis, Pacific Opera, Young Peoples Theatre, Tarragon Theatre, Factory Theatre, Nightwood Theatre, Canadian Stage and others. Her work in theatre was awarded with five Dora Mavor Moore Awards and seventeen Nominations. She is a recipient of two Gemini Awards for Film and Television Production Design : *Don Giovanni Unmasked*, *Stormy Weather*, (Producer: Rhombus Media) She is a member of the Royal Canadian Academy of Arts and Associated Designers of Canada.



KHADIJAH ROBERTS-ABDULLAH is a Toronto based actor,writer, and director. Living her life at a multitude of intersections, Khadijah's work is motivated by a pursuit of artistic expression that aims to challenge understandings of visibility and inclusivity. Whether working alongside like-minded artists or producing work through her multimedia company, 2Skins Entertainment, Khadijah always strives to create art that amplifies the voices of those who exist in the margins of our society.



MUMBI TINDYEBWA OTU is a Kenyan-Ugandan-Canadian theatre director and current Artistic Director of Obsidian Theatre, Canada's leading creator for Black Art as well as Founder/Artistic director for the experimental theatre company IFT (It's A Freedom Thing Theatre) Theatre.

Recent directing credits, include *FLEX* (Obsidian/Crows) *Three Sisters* (Obsidian/Soulpepper), *Is God Is* (Obsidian/anadian Stage/Necessary Angel), *21 Black Futures* (Obsidian/CBC Arts), *Trout Stanley* (Factory Theatre), *Sizwe Banzi is Dead*, *The Brothers Size*, *Ma Rainey's Black Bottom* (Soulpepper Theatre), *Post Democracy*, *A profoundly affectionate* (Tarragon Theatre) amongst others.

Mumbi is also the recipient of many awards including a Canadian Screen Award, a Dora Award, a Toronto Theatre Critics Award, a Pauline McGibbon Award and a Mallory Gilbert Protege Award.



MING WONG 黄慧明 is a Toronto based costume designer working in musical theatre, theatre, dance, opera, film, and television for over 15 years. Her work spans from period and contemporary to the unusual and unconventional. Most recent work includes *Natasha, Pierre, & The Great Comet of 1812* for Mirvish Productions/Crow's, *Wait Until Dark* for Shaw Festival, and the current Soulpepper/Adam Blanshay/Pemberley US Tour of *Kim's Convenience*. 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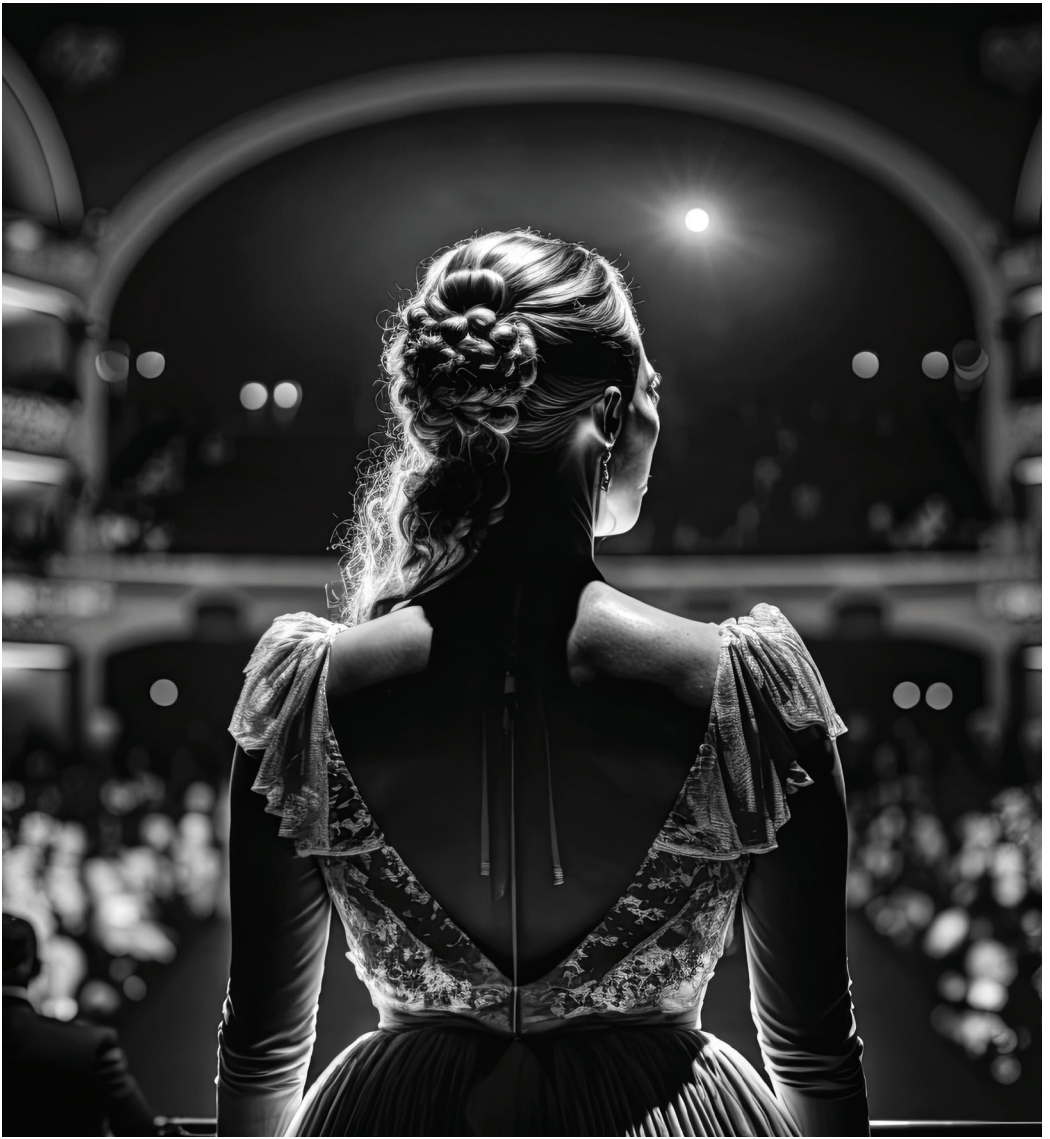
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
