

Welcome to our 2022 Season. It is truly a pleasure to welcome you back to the theatre. Planning our 25th season during a time when theatres were closed across the globe made me reflect on what truly makes what we do essential. We are honoured to be a place that brings us all back together, side by side, to share collective experiences again. We wanted to plan a season that celebrates all that we are, and all the artists who have been waiting to share their stories. So we have programmed some of the most exciting contemporary writers in our country and beyond, including a long awaited new play from our beloved alum, Kim's Convenience writer Ins Choi, Bad Parent. We also return to a Shakespeare with King Lear, helmed by one of our most exciting Canadian directors Kim Collier. It is paired with a provocative new play called Queen Goneril, which takes us to the setting of King Lear, but seven years earlier, to imagine the world experiences through the eyes of his daughters, written by another force of the Canadian theatre, playwright Erin Shields.

I really can't wait for you to see the next two shows up in our season, *Where the Blood Mixes* and *Kamloopa*, both Governor General award winning plays by Kevin Loring and Kim Senklip Harvey. *Where The Blood Mixes* is both incredibly moving and vital to further understanding the history of this country, and *Kamloopa* is an irreverent and fearless story that invites audiences on a hilarious soul-searching adventure. I am very proud to be opening the season with Dominique Morisseau's *Pipeline*. This is one of the few plays that we held on to from our previously planned season that was cancelled. When we first programmed this play in 2019 the widespread collective conversations that came out around the murder of George Floyd had not happened yet. Though these conversations have started to give many of us an understanding of the realities that uphold biased systems, this play takes us to the centre of a lived experience, a personal story that is at once searing and full of heart. It is led by another wonderful Soulpepper alum Akosua Amo-Adem in the title role.

Welcome to Gideon. I'm also very pleased to welcome my brilliant new collaborator, Soulpepper's new Executive Director, Gideon Arthurs. This is his first show with us, and I'm thrilled to have his thoughtful leadership at the Company. I hope you will have a chance to get to know Gideon in the coming months.

Gideon and I want Soulpepper to be the place that helps us discover the connections that make us stronger as a community. We are opening our doors back up, inviting as many people as possible into our theatres, offering relaxed performances and other access initiatives, Community Conversations that dive deeper into the themes of our work, and continuing our successful Free 25 & Under program.

We are so grateful to our staff, board and the many artists who have worked with us through the past trying two years, ensuring that we re-emerge energized with purpose and passion, and we are especially grateful to you, for being here to support live theatre! We invite you to explore the season and join us again soon so we can all continue the celebration.

WELCOME BAAAAACK!!!

Thank you so much for coming out to the theatre today! You have no idea how much I have missed you!!!!

I have been waiting two whole years to share *Pipeline* with you! When I first read this play, I connected deeply with the character Nya and understood all too well the pain, fear, and exhaustion that comes with having to advocate for young Black bodies to be treated with the same dignity as everyone else in their schools. Although I am not a mother (yet), I am a sister to a large six-foot-four Black man named Junior. Junior is the kindest, most gentle man I know. A man who could have easily fallen down the 'Pipeline' when he was in school because of the negative stereotypes and preconceived notions about his intelligence that are associated with the way he looked. Fortunately, Junior had a diligent big sister in me, who was willing to advocate on his behalf. But not every child has this.

I hope this play provokes more questions and conversations about our educational system and the Black body. How can we do better as a city to ensure that all our young Black kids have a chance to reach their potential in the space where they spend the most amount of time.

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BACKGROUND NOTES

Believe me, I loved you all. Believe me, I knew you, though faintly, and I loved, I loved you All. – The Mother.

These words of the great African American poet Gwendolyn Brooks are apt, not only because you will hear one of her poems tonight, but because they express how we feel as we welcome you back to our theatre. We've missed you! Thank you for being here to experience our first show in two years.

Pipeline is a ride. Playwright Dominique Morisseau tackles an urgent subject with clarity, a wide-open heart, and sharp humour. She wrote Audience Rules of Engagement for this play, and the first one is: *You are allowed to laugh audibly.*

The play's title refers to what has been called the school-to-prison pipeline, the way school discipline can lead young people directly into the criminal justice system, a trajectory that disproportionately affects Black children. Research conducted by the Toronto District School Board recently revealed that for every suspended White student, there were 3 suspended Black students. These suspensions can begin as early as the age of six. What does this systemic animus do to students of colour? To their parents? How can families help their children avoid 'becoming the expectation,' as one of the play's characters puts it?

If you're Nya, the poorly paid high school English teacher and divorced single mother at the heart of this story, you teach at a public high school, but you send your son to private school as part of your ongoing effort to subvert those expectations. Your son is one of only a handful of students of colour in this privileged environment. How will you protect him if he collides with the unacknowledged but pervasive racism there? What does it take to protect a vulnerable, headstrong Black boy in this world? A young man who is full of feeling, still finding his way. Gwendolyn Brooks describes the tumult of adolescent emotions in *Boy Breaking Glass:*

> "I shall create! If not a note, a hole. If not an overture, a desecration."

Full of pepper and light and Salt and night and cargoes.

There are no easy answers. However, the last of Morisseau's Rules of Engagement emphasizes the humanity of her theatrical vision: *Exhale together*. *Laugh together. Say amen, should you need to. This is a community. Let's go.*

Playwright Biography:

Dominique Morisseau is a playwright, actress, and creative force. Her plays include *The Detroit Projects*, a trilogy (*Detroit '67, Paradise Blue, Skeleton Crew*) set in her native city. Named one of the 20 Most Produced Playwrights in the U.S. in 2016, her accolades include an August Wilson Playwriting Award and a 2018 MacArthur "Genius" Grant. She co-wrote the "exuberantly entertaining" (Tony Award nominated) jukebox musical *Ain't Too Proud: The Life and Times of the Temptations* in 2019. Ms. Morisseau was a co-producer and story editor on the Showtime television series, *Shameless*.
